Dear Parents and Carers,

This will be my last newsletter before retiring. I leave the school in the capable hands of Mrs Hudson who will be the acting Executive Head Teacher. She will be assisted by Mrs Gravett, acting Deputy Head and Mr Lane, Assistant Head, until the new Executive Head teacher, Mrs Richardson, takes up her post in January 2021.

I shall take away many memories of my time at the school. It has been a real joy to see children grow and flourish, particularly where they have succeeded in the face of significant challenges. At Christ Church we have sought to instil values so that children can act with integrity as they go on through life. ## **Hot meals**

We have reviewed our arrangements for Covid safe service of lunches and will be able to offer a hot meal every day to children after half term.
