Be Smart Code

In our last newsletter in the spring we mentioned our new Be Smart Code to support Digital Literacy. We have had a lot of positive feedback from the children, some of whom helped to design the new code.

Our new code has 5 pillars:

Be Sharp and Think - what is safe to share?

Be Alert and Check - is it a scam?

Be Secure and Protect - create strong passwords

Be Kind and Respect - respect other people

Be Brave and Discuss - ask for help from a trusted adults

Chromebooks

Using Social Media

A number of children are telling us that they have their own social media accounts, including WhatsApp, Instagram and TikTok

Please be aware that the age limit for social media accounts is 13 and for WhatsApp it is 16 The [NSPCC's net aware site](#) will help you to stay informed.

If you are happy to allow your child to use your own account, then that is your decision. However, if a child has created their own account, they will have provided a false date of birth and that is contrary to our school value of Honesty.

If you are happy to allow your child to break the rules to have their own account, then please ensure that the privacy settings are "private" so that they cannot contact or be contacted by people they don't know offline. Make sure that you know what they are doing, whom they are in contact with and what the dangers are. **Above all, please check what they are posting.**
