Our termly strands are based on the Characteristics of effective learning from the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum.

This term we will be focusing on: ***Active learning; being involved and concentrating***

The activities, learning journeys and experiences will be based on the interests of the children so that we can ensure learner motivation

This term your child will be....

- ❖ Exploring a variety of traditional fairy tales and fictional stories and learning to retell them.
- ❖ Engaging with traditional stories from other cultures and backgrounds.
- ❖ Extending their story vocabulary and learning new words.
- ❖ Looking at famous authors including Julia Donaldson and learning parts of stories to join in with reading.
- ❖ Speaking and listening about their own cultures and traditions. Sharing family experiences on seesaw and using 'Show and Tell'.
- ❖ Developing their segmenting skills to write and read words in a variety of focused writing and reading tasks.
- ❖ Continuing to develop their fine motor skills to form letters and numerals confidently.
- ❖ Developing knowledge of 'high frequency/ sight words' to support writing and reading tasks.
- ❖ Applying their skills in number to maths problem solving.
- ❖ Developing social skills by playing alongside others, waiting for their turn and following rules.

How can you help your child at home?

- ★ Try to reduce screen time. We're very aware that your child needs to use a screen to access their remote learning so please try to limit other screen usage and allow them to play with physical toys, let them help you cook, use playdough etc.
- ★ Set your child up with a consistent routine for remote learning and if possible try to support them to complete their daily remote learning which is set on Seesaw.
- ★ Support your child with being independent, using cutlery at meal times, changing themselves and putting on boots and shoes etc.
- ★ Remind them about handwashing and how to do this effectively (singing Happy Birthday twice is an easy way for them to time themselves).
- ★ Introduce some dice games with your children.
