Nurturing lifelong learners with God's guidance Primary School Sport Premium Funding

The total Sport Premium Funding received at Christ Church for the academic year 2019/20 was paid in two instalments; one of £8,296 and another of £11,614 making a total of £19,910. This funding is ring fenced and therefore can only be spent on PE and sport provision in schools. This funding stream is guaranteed until 2020.

How we have spent our funding:

With the continued provision and increase in sport funding we have been able to invest in a number of areas which as a result have greatly improved the quality of teaching within PE lessons, swimming and greater opportunities for children to fully participate in extracurricular sport. The school has been able to sustain stronger links with outside sports agencies, providing children with the opportunity to progress in sport to a higher level.

Impact of membership of the Croydon School Sport Partnership:

Membership to CSSP has continued to have a large and sustained impact on Christ Church, helping to raise standards of PE through CPD opportunities and access to a range of competitions.

Thank you to David Smith (CSSP representative for South Croydon) and his team who have provided support to Christ Church School staff and put on a wide range of competitions giving our children the chance to participate in a wide variety of sports.

Miss Preston and Mr Burke (previous and current PE coordinators) and CSSP representatives, along with Mr Richards (specialist PE assistant) have been in regular contact throughout the year to arrange dates, festivals, in-house support, and to ensure that sport is at the forefront of the school.

Last year, CSSP provided whole school inset focusing on the teaching of Real PE. He also has worked regularly with class teachers leading Real PE lessons in school. Areas covered included Real PE/Multi-skills, ball skills, orienteering, cricket and football. Miss Preston led Real PE inset in Autumn 2019 on 'Jasmine', our Real PE interactive planning resource. Year 5 were also given Leadership training for work with younger children in the school.

As a result of the CPD offered, staff are confident in:

- planning and delivering high quality PE
- creating inclusive PE lessons
- showing progress across lessons
- PE as a way of developing the whole child

In September 2019 Liam Garnet took over David's role and has continued to work closely with the school.

Membership to CSSP has allowed us to increase participation in competitive school sport.

Christ Church also achieved the Gold School Games Mark award this year, following the previous year's silver award.

Sporting Successes 2019/20:

Cross Country

In the Autumn Term our Year 3 team took part the Croydon Cross Country competition. The Year 3 girls team won and became 2019 Croydon Champions for their age group! The team was made up of Ebony 5th, Tilly 18th, Mollie 57th and Abigail 139th. This was out of 175 runners! Ebony has done particularly well as this follows her winning the KS1 cross country competition when she was in Year 2. In the Year 3 boys event Kamil came 42nd and Jacob 70th out of 172 runners.

At the KS1 Cross Country event Lily in Year 2 came first in the borough! Scarlet in Year 1 came 16th in a large field of runners. In the Year 1 boys race Matthew came 58th in the borough. Year 5 and 6 entered a team in the upper KS2 event, showing promising performances.

Athletics

A number of children completed training during the summer term and were selected to compete at the Croydon Schools' athletics competition. Competitions took place over three sessions after school at the end of June.

The boys selected to represent Christ Church School were Dan Martin, Clayton Kameni, Amari Donkor and Emilio Bortagaray from Y6, Caleb Williams and Luke Bradley from Y5, Benji Daniel from Y4 and Cole Cummings from Y3.

The girls selected to represent Christ Church School were Ruby GPS, Saniya Mistry and Gabbi Trimbee from Y6, Ruby Edwards and Claire Chari from Y5, Lorelia Guiaguin from Y4 and Lydia Martin from Y3.

Amari, Luke, Caleb W, Ruby GPS and Lorelia all qualified for the semi-finals/finals day on the Wednesday. Caleb W qualified for Year 5 high jump but was unable to make the finals due to other commitments. Amari came 7th in the Year 6 long jump, Luke took part in the finals for the Year 5 long jump, Ruby GPS came 6th for throwing a rounders ball and Lorelia came 3rd in the semi-finals for Year 4 sprints.

Lorelia just missed out on qualifying for the finals, but she did run in the Year 5 and Year 6 relay team for us! Fantastic team spirit was shown by all.

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Swimming

Swimming Gala 2019: 24 children took part in the Croydon School Swimming Gala. They first had to battle though the trials and two training sessions before the Gala took place to ensure that they were ready to compete. There were 24 events in the swimming gala and Christ Church entered at least one representative for 21 of the 24 events. Of those 21 events, we managed to get top three finishes in 17 races! Every swimmer had improved their times from the trials, which proved that their hard work in the training sessions had paid off. Once the Gala was over, all their times were compared with the times from the other three Galas that had taken place and a results table was created to see who would progress to the finals, which would be held at Trinity High School. Caleb Thompson (6HP) had qualified fastest in the Yr6 boys backstroke and third fastest in the boys open butterfly. Caleb Neal (5B) also qualified for the finals being the sixth fastest in Yr5 backstroke. At the Finals, both boys had photo finishes for their events as it was that close. Caleb Thompson was the Croydon Champion in Yr6 boys backstroke and gained a silver in the boys open butterfly. Caleb Neal managed to gain a bronze in the Yr5 boys backstroke. Miss Doyle and Miss Preston were extremely impressed with everyone who took part.

London Youth Games: Caleb Thompson, after successes in the local swimming gala, was selected to represent Croydon at the London Youth Games. His individual event was 50m backstroke where he came second by 0.2 of a second. He also competed in two different relay races and the Croydon team won both of these. Overall Croydon came 2nd out of 30 London boroughs. Congratulations to both Caleb and Lexie.

Diving: In March 2019 Lexie Clarke was the Gold Medallist in the East region Skills Qualifiers (youngest diver) scoring 30 points over her personal best! She went on to be awarded the silver medal at the National Skills Finals in Plymouth. Lexie also won the South of England Regional Diving Skills competition scoring a perfect 10. She qualified for her first Nationals and finished 5th. In the autumn term she attended England Talent Games and finished third. She is now recognised as one of the top up and coming juniors in the country. Congratulations Lexie!

Gymnastics

In April 2019 Lexie Clarke was the Gold medallist at the London Regional Gymnastics Championships. She qualified for the finals being selected for Team London. In the May competition, she was overall Silver medallist at the National finals. She was placed 1st on beam, 2nd on floor, 3rd on bars, 4th on vault (out

of 54 competitors from GB). Lexie also has successes in diving. In March 2019 she was the Gold Medallist in the East region Skills Qualifiers (youngest diver) scoring 30 points over her personal best! This month she was awarded the silver medal at the National Skills Finals in Plymouth.

Football

Last season, Christ Church finished 4th of six in our league and got to a cup semi-final, losing 2-1 in extra time.

We gave 24 children the chance to represent our school in league, cup and one day competitions. Every child who applied to be in a team got to represent the school at some point during the season.

Hockey

Quicksticks Hockey Finals: Last Spring, six children including Daniel Smith, Daniel Martin, Claire Chari, Aarav Gupta, Saniya Mistry and Ruby Ganpatsingh, participated in the Croydon quicksticks hockey finals at Croydon High School. The team played in cold and damp conditions; they kept going right to the end and tried hard against very good opposition. We are officially the sixth best school in Croydon for under 11's in 2019.

Tennis

In September 2019 we started 2 after school tennis clubs for Years 1/2 and Years 3/4 run by MDL Coaching.

Table Tennis

Mr Richards runs a regular after school table tennis club where children can learn how to play from scratch to a level where they can compete with their own peer groups. The club is always over-subscribed. In the Summer Term they had a competition which started with 25 competitors. The trophy was won by Daniel Martin in a thrilling game played against Claire Chari. Luke Bradley and Ben Venckus also did very well coming 3rd and 4th in this competition. All the children played well and should be proud of their contribution. The children have played as a team in competitions and in staged friendly matches.

Basketball

Basketball competition: In the Summer Term our Year 5 team of Luke, Nehemiah, Caleb W, Claire and Ruby came 4th overall. Ruby Edwards was the top scorer. They reached the semi-finals. Each child worked really hard to give their best efforts for as long as possible in some very difficult hard fought games. They supported each other throughout the competition. Our Year 6 team of Saniya, Amy C, Benediktas and Dan M came 3rd overall with Benediktas Venckus as the top goal scorer. They were one basket short of qualifying for the final. Mr Richards said that the way they played throughout was fantastic to watch. After being unlucky in their first match they quickly

improved their team work against some quick, skilful and tall opposition. They supported each other brilliantly and showed great belief and determination in the teamwork systems they came up with.

Additional clubs and competitions

Kwik cricket club took place over a few weeks after school as practice/trials for an upcoming competition. We also entered Year 5/6 teams (boys and girls) in tag rugby and mini-tennis competitions, giving children an opportunity, which they might not otherwise have had, to participate in sports played at a high level in our borough. Children who took part in these events got better the more they played and, by the end of the competitions, gave an excellent account of themselves, getting close to winning and becoming increasingly competitive within their matches. Our inclusive approach is designed to emphasise that sport is for all.

England vs Montenegro Wembley Trip

On 14th November, 21 children from Y5/6 and 6 members of staff had the exciting opportunity to go to Wembley Stadium to watch England's 1000th international game. It was a fantastic match! We were lucky enough to see England score 7 goals which was the biggest home victory for England since 1987! We travelled there and back by public transport with 77,000 other supporters. The Y5/6 children were so sensible, well-behaved and such brilliant ambassadors for Christ Church.

Impact of employment of Specialist PE assistant

Our PE specialist Marc Richards has a range of sports knowledge and understanding of how to progress skills learning. Marc works alongside class teachers in years 2-6, having an impact on over 300 pupils and their physical activity. He meets with class teachers on a termly basis to discuss medium term plans and the progression of skills.

"Mr Richards engages and inspires all children so that every child feels they have been successful with Mr Richards' support. His knowledge of the skills required for each sport is outstanding. He is excellent at identifying each child's ability and then develops achievable steps to help the child improve. Mr Richards also provides great support for the teachers and aids them with their professional development. He takes the time to explain the process of learning in the sport you are teaching and will give you helpful tips to support and extend the children." (Class 5 Teacher)

Children have commented on how Mr Richards has helped them:

- "Whenever I am not quite right in PE he says it is a good try and then tells me how to improve"
- "Mr Richards teaches us how to do things step-by-step and then it makes us better. He doesn't make us do the hard bits straight away"

 "Mr Richards always tells me I am doing a good job and he helps me get better and better"

Impact of trained additional teachers for swimming lessons

The additional swimming teacher, Miss Doyle, has enabled children to be taught in smaller groups, receiving more time with the swimming teachers.
