ICT Mark

We were awarded the ICT Mark at the end of the last school year and we have just received the report. The assessor spoke to parents, children, teachers and Governors and was very impressed by what she saw and heard.

What is a friend?

One of the things highlighted in the ICT Mark report is that children are sometimes confused when they use the word "friend" to talk about people they "know" online. Talking to the children, they all seem very clear about what a "stranger" is, but a great many of them seem to think that people that they play online games with are "friends". One child in year 2 said he has "100s of friends that I play with", whilst a child in year 3 said "my mum checks the profile of people I play with to make sure they are OK to be my friend".

We will be doing a lot of learning over the coming months to help children to recognise the difference between a friend and someone they only know through online interaction.

Parentzone Conference

Last week Mrs Elfred attended a conference organised by Parentzone and CEOP. She came back brimming with ideas to better support children and parents with Digital Literacy and is looking forward to sharing these over the coming weeks and months.
